ELDERS

BOB CURTIS (Mission Division - Class of 2024)

JANET OLSON (Class of 2024)



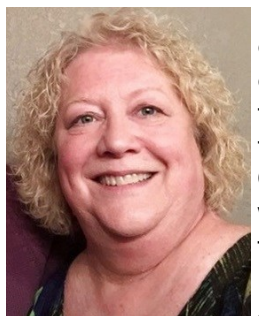
