Help us all remember our responsibility to you, to each other, and to our planet.

United as a community of faith and as the Body of Christ, we lift these prayers up to you, Creator, Redeemer, and Sustainer. Hear us as we join our hearts and our voices in praying the prayer Christ taught us to pray by saying,
