Pastor: This is a day of remembrance for us.


People: We lift up the cup of salvation and call on the name of the Lord.

GREAT PRAYER OF THANKSGIVING

Pastor: The Lord be with you.

People: And also with you.

Pastor: Lift up your hearts.

People: We lift them up to the Lord.

Pastor: Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

People: It is right for us to give thanks and praise. It is our joy and our peace at all times

and in all places to give thanks to you, O Lord, our God, author of the universe.

Pastor: With joy we praise you, gracious God, for you created heaven and earth, made

us in your image and kept covenant with us – even when we fell into sin. We give you thanks for Jesus Christ, our Lord, who by his life, death, and

resurrection, opened to us the way of everlasting life.

WORDS OF INSTITUTION

Pastor: We give thanks to God that our Savior, Jesus Christ, before he suffered, gave us

this feast of his sacrifice until he comes again. At the Last Supper, the Lord Jesus Christ took bread, and when he had given thanks, he broke it and said: "This is

my body which is for you; do this in remembrance of me."

In the same way, after supper, he took the cup and said: "This cup is the new covenant in my blood; do this in remembrance of me." For whenever we eat this bread and drink this cup, we proclaim the Lord's death until he comes again. Therefore we proclaim our faith as signed and sealed in this sacrament.

People: Christ has died. Christ is risen. Christ will come again.

PRAYER OF CONSECRATION


Pastor:

If you are worshiping via live stream, place a plate with bread or crackers and a cup with juice, wine, water, or other common beverage in your home worship space. Wherever you are, you are invited to partake of the bread and the cup.

If you are worshiping in person, please come down the center aisle to receive the communion elements; partake and return to your seat using the side aisles. Ushers will bring communion to the seats of those who cannot come forward.


DRAWING NEAR TO CHRIST IN HIS SUFFERING
