The Rev. Dr. Aart M. van Beek is a writer of fiction and non-fiction in three languages: English, Indonesian and Dutch and is a California Courts registered interpreter for Indonesian and Dutch. He has served several congregations as an ordained Presbyterian Church (USA) pastor for 23 years, including CPC as Interim Pastor from 1988-1989. He has been country co-director of Church World Service in East Timor and in Indonesia where he had earlier served as hospital social worker. He served as counseling training director for a national health care and hospital organization in Indonesia. Aart taught at Satya Wacana Christian University and Jakarta Theological Seminary in Indonesia and St. Mary's College of California for a total of twelve years and he has given lectures in Korea. He served as an adjunct professor in the D.Min. program at San Francisco Theological Seminary in San Anselmo CA for four years. Aart is married to Carolyn Chan van Beek. They have two adult sons, Daniel and Andrew.


